Prime Minister (/Premier) David Cameron is no doubt (/most probably) one of the first to rejoice. On the day of the announcement, last Tuesday, he even appeared (/ made an appearance /came out) on the doorstep of Number 10 (=> bonification) (/ Number Ten Downing Street /Ten Downing Street /the Ten Downing Street) to applaud (/ welcome) "this really sensational piece of news", going as far as to suggest (/ even proposing) that the day of the wedding be declared (/ decreed) a bank holiday (/ legal holiday / public holiday).
